

KITCHEN CABINETS

Q. How long are your cabinets guaranteed for?

A. All of our cabinets come with a manufacturer's guarantee of 25 years, so you can be sure that your UK manufactured cabinet is of a quality that is built to last.

Q. What is supplied with each cabinet?

A. Our rigid and ready to fit cabinets come with a whole host of features including: soft close as standard, full extension drawer boxes, adjustable legs and clip on hinges. Each cabinet's contents are shown in the 'contents' section of the product page.

Q. What cabinet finishes do you offer?

A. Our cabinets come in both oak and white, so you can personalise your kitchen by choosing either a complementary door finish or a contrasting one.

Q. What sizes do your cabinets come in?

A. For dimensions of all our cabinets, please see the relevant [Range Overview](#) for your chosen kitchen.

Q. How thick are the kitchen cabinets you supply?

A. Our high-quality rigid built cabinets are 18mm thick, ensuring both durability and strength.

Q. What are the depths of the cabinets?

A. The base cabinets have a depth of 570mm and the wall cabinets have a depth of 330mm.

Q. Is there a service void in the base cabinets for pipe work?

A. Yes, there is a service void of 60mm.

Q. What height do I set the cabinet legs to?

A. This will depend on your flooring. If your flooring is going all the way under the cabinets you need to set the legs at 140mm. If your flooring is going to sit flush to the plinth then your legs will need to be set at 140mm, plus the height of your flooring.

DOORS AND DRAWERS

Q. How many door and drawer finishes do you offer?

A. We offer the following six fashionable finishes:

- **Oak Slab** - Brings a touch of the traditional to a modern style kitchen with long clean lines.
- **Oak Shaker** - Drawing on the traditional this can be made highly contemporary by adding bold wall colours.
- **White Gloss Slab** - With strong lines and a high gloss finish, this white kitchen complements modern living.
- **White Gloss Shaker** - A stunning white gloss finish fitted kitchen in a simple, shaker style.
- **Cream Gloss Slab** - Smooth surfaces with a high gloss finish, this kitchen has a contemporary living feel, yet could be tailored to the traditional kitchen.
- **Mussel Shaker** - A contemporary painted wood fitted kitchen that draws on heritage style.

So whatever your taste, we are sure to have a kitchen to suit.

FINISHING TOUCHES

Q. What finishing touches do I need to consider?

A. Once you have bought your cabinets, doors, drawers, worktops and handles you need to consider whether you also require any panels, plinths and cornices. We also stock wirework for storage solutions, lighting and other kitchen accessories. These additions can give your kitchen the 'wow'-factor, as well as making your space more practical.

Q. What are panels used for?

A. These are used to finish off exposed cabinet ends or to fill a gap where cabinets do not fit. They can also be used to create cavities too – such as an area to house a fridge or a dishwasher.

Q. What are plinths used for?

A. Plinths fit to the bottom outer-edge of your base cabinets for the perfect finishing touch.

Q. What are cornices/pelmets used for?

A. For a seamless finish, fix cornices or pelmets to the outer edge on the bottom/top of your wall cabinets.

BUYING

Q. How much does a new kitchen cost?

A. The cost of a new kitchen depends on a number of different factors e.g. the size of your space, your final layout and your chosen materials. Therefore, it's a good idea to sit down and work out your budget before choosing your kitchen. However, you can always be guaranteed that Screwfix kitchens offer affordability as well as quality.

Q. How can I update my kitchen on a budget?

A. If your budget will not stretch as far as an entirely new kitchen – do not forget that new doors and handles can transform an old kitchen at a fraction of the cost.

Q. How do I measure up for my kitchen?

A. First of all map out your current kitchen layout (or empty kitchen if you plan to start from scratch) on graph paper recording your measurements in mms. Add the overall wall lengths of each wall and the ceiling height for the wall elevations. Then highlight the precise positioning of fixed items such as windows, doors and chimneybreasts (if applicable) and highlight where the radiators, electric sockets, gas supply points and plumbing are.

DELIVERY

Q. When will my kitchen be delivered?

A. All of our kitchens can be delivered within seven days of your order being placed. However, first you will be contacted directly by the supplier to arrange a convenient delivery date - Monday to Friday only. Please note that large items can only be delivered to an external ground floor location at the delivery address specified. A signature will be required upon delivery.

Q. How much will delivery cost?

A. The delivery of your Screwfix kitchen is absolutely free with no minimum order value or quantity.

Q. Can the kitchen be delivered to an alternative address?

A. We will deliver direct to you, to your customer or to site. It is easy to add another delivery address to your account, just select deliver to a different address or person when you are checking out or go to My Account, where you can manage your address list. All addresses will be saved and available to pick every time you order.

Q. Can you guarantee a specific delivery date and time?

A. Please do not schedule any installation work prior to the supplier contacting you. They will do their best to deliver by a specific date and time but it is better to receive prior confirmation first.

SERVICE

Q. Do you offer a replacement service?

A. Yes, we offer a 48 hour replacement service should any items have been delivered incorrectly.

Q. What should I do if one of my items is delivered damaged?

INSTALLATION

Q. Where do I start fitting my kitchen cabinets?

A. Always start in the corner of the room. For further information, please see our Installation Guide [here](#).

Q. What tools will I need to complete my kitchen?

A. We recommend the following:

- Cross-headed screwdriver
- 5mm flat screwdriver
- Metric tape measure
- Pencil
- Spirit level
- Square edge
- Electric drill with 8mm, 5mm, 3mm diameter wood drill bits and appropriate masonry drill bits
- Jigsaw
- Hacksaw
- Panel saw
- Bradawl
- Mallet
- At least 2 G clamps, mitre block
- Workbench or stable, firm work surface
- Silicone sealant
- Wall plus or plasterboard fixings.

Q. I have just had my walls plastered, how long should I wait before I can start installing my kitchen?

A. The plaster must be fully dry before you commence instalment. Drying times depend upon a number of different factors e.g. the product that's been used and the environment/temperature the plastering has been carried out in. To be on the safe side, always seek advise from the tradesperson who has carried out the plastering for you.

Q. How can I disguise an exposed cabinet end?

A. Whenever a cabinet has a visible side you will need to purchase an end support panel. These panels are available across all our ranges along with scribing panels, appliance panels and wall panels.

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Cabinet Specification

SCREWFIX KITCHENS CABINET SPECIFICATION

Our cabinets are made up of 18mm panels for maximum durability and incorporate solid backs and soft-close mechanisms as standard for both doors and drawers. All wall cabinets are designed to take 12-inch dinner plates.

- Easy to install:** Concealed wall hanging brackets, with locking mechanisms and metallic covers.
- Soft close drawers:** All drawers are double skinned, full extension, with integrated soft close as standard.
- Soft close doors:** All cabinets are supplied with hinges with soft closers included as standard.
- Anti-tit shelves:** Concealed shelf brackets with anti-tit solution.
- Rigid construction ready to fit:** Cabinets are all glued and dowelled with stapled 4mm MDF backs for additional rigidity.
- Deep wall units for large dinner plates:** 330mm deep.
- Minimum drill holes:** We have eliminated all unnecessary holes.
- Sturdy carcass:** Made from 18mm material.
- Edges do not chip:** Edged with hardwearing 1mm ABS edging.
- Easy to level:** With adjustable legs (-5mm to +25mm) for installation on uneven surfaces.
- Service Void:** Base units have a 60mm service void behind the back panel for pipes.

Kitchens are seen as the heart of the home, which is why designing and choosing your new one can be such a stressful and daunting experience. Here at Screwfix we understand how important your kitchen is, which is why we have created this handy guide to help you through each stage of the process. With lots of helpful tips from planning through to ordering, this guide will show you how you can create your ideal kitchen easily and stay stress-free!

How much does a new kitchen cost?
The cost of a new kitchen depends on a number of different factors. For example the size of your space, your final layout and your chosen materials. Therefore, it is a good idea to sit down and work out your budget before choosing your kitchen. This way you will stay within your limits and will not face the disappointment of finding your perfect kitchen only to discover that it is way beyond your means.

When budgeting, always consider the following:

- Old Kitchen Disposal and Site Preparation:** Have you thought about how you are going to dispose of your old kitchen and appliances? Also, since the old kitchen has been removed, will any of the walls require re-clastering? Have you considered your heating? Do you need to allow for the position of radiators or duct heaters, or are you opting for under-floor heating? Will you need to re-route any electrics or plumbing?
- Kitchen Cabinets:** Do you require your entire kitchen replacing or have your current cabinets still got plenty of years use left? Remember new doors and/or handles can refresh a tired kitchen relatively cheaply and quickly.
- Kitchen Worktops:** Worktops can have a great impact upon the overall cost. Laminate worktops offer great value and we offer both stone and wood effect worktops. However, if you need to achieve the 'wow-factor' then we also sell solid wood versions and Magna (18mm thick solid surface top mounted on an MDF base) and Slab Tech (30mm thick solid surface worktop).
- Appliances and White Goods:** Will your current appliances still fit in with the overall look of your new kitchen? If not, you need to build in replacement costs when you are first working out your budget.

Small and larger kitchen spaces. Below are diagrams of the six most common kitchen layouts, which show working triangles to choose.

How to design a kitchen layout?

- To plan your kitchen effectively, it is best to sketch out your current kitchen layout (or the dimensions of your empty kitchen if you are starting from scratch) on a piece of graph paper and add all relevant measurements. We have included a piece of graph paper at the back of this guide to help you.
- Start by mapping out the length, width and height of the room, highlighting all doors and windows (and their relevant measurements and distance from floor and ceiling). Then add all fixed items such as chimney breasts, radiators, power sockets, boilers and gas and water supply points. Take your time and measure as accurately as possible, as this will ensure that when you come to fit the cabinets they will all fit exactly as you planned. Also, do not forget to record all of your dimensions in millimetres, as the kitchen cabinets sold on our site are all shown in metric measurements.
- Finally, add your current kitchen cabinets if you want to follow the same layout. Alternatively, determine the layout that best suits your kitchen space (examples of common ones are shown on pages 3 and 4) and start adding in the cabinets on your plan based on these.

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
